Meet the team: Peter Adams

Peter completed his Secondary Education at Albury High School and having been awarded a Teacher's College Scholarship moved to Sydney enrolling in a Science degree course.

He holds a Bachelor of Science (Chemistry) degree from the University of New South Wales, a Diploma in Business Studies from the University of New England and a Graduate Diploma of Applied Science from Charles Sturt University.

He relinquished his scholarship to study part time and began his career as a Chemist with confectionery company James Stedman Henderson (now part of Nestlé) moving on to be Research Chemist with James Barnes (fats and oils, meat extracts) now part of H J Heinz. On completion of his course travelled to England with his fiance where they were married and then migrated to Toronto, Canada where he was employed by the Canada Bread Company as a Product Developer. While there he became co-inventor of several patented processes for the manufacture of snack food products.

With the birth of their first child they returned to Australia and he became Factory Chemist at Arnotts Biscuits Homebush factory and shortly afterward was chosen as the first in-house management trainee.

He progressed through a number of roles where he was responsible for major capital expenditure projects including the automation of Sao manufacture and the continuous production of chocolate biscuits. In the late eighties he obtained Board support for his vision to relocate manufacturing from Homebush to the western suburbs of Sydney. He selected the land, negotiated its acquisition and project led the establishment of a new \$24million state of the art distribution center and subsequently a new manufacturing facility at Huntingwood.

He was appointed General Manager Manufacturing for the Arnott group and led task forces one of which developed a manufacturing strategy which resulted in the rationalisation of manufacturing facilities nationally from seven to the current three factories providing substantial cost reductions. He served 21 years at Arnott's.

A succession of general management roles followed which included Westons Biscuits, Defiance Fine Foods, Ricegrowers Co-operative and Kellogg achieving HACCP accreditation.

He retired from the workforce in July, 2006 to move with his family back to the Wagga Wagga area where he grew cereal and oilseed crops.

The millenium drought necessitated the need to obtain off farm income and he obtained employment at H J Heinz as Product Development Manager and later in a technical role at Allied Pinnacle in Cowra a producer of ingredients for the baking industry which included Fondant, Caramel, Jams & Fillings, Custard and Glazes for customers such as Arnott's, Krispy Kreme, Sara Lee and Bakers Delight among others. During his first two years at Cowra he successfully oversaw an increase in Stock Keeping Units from 56 to in excess of 200.

Following comprehensive audits by Woolworths, Coles and SAI Global obtained Woolworths Quality Accreditation, Coles Food Manufacturer Standard Requirements and British retail Consortium accreditation.

He left Allied Pinnacle and retired from the workforce permanently in early 2019 relocating to Canberra at the end of that year.
