

Meet the team: Roger Quarterman - Newsletter Editor

Roger is a retired Chartered Professional Engineer, who has divided his working life fairly evenly between doing engineering and teaching it. In addition to engineering he has tertiary qualifications in economics and adult education

Originally raised and educated in England he has also lived and worked in the USA and Northern Rhodesia/Zambia. Whilst in Zambia he served in the police reserve and amongst other interesting experiences observed the transition from colonial Northern Rhodesia to independent Zambia. He has always had a keen interest in community service organisations, and has been involved in the Scout movement, Apex and Rotary where he was a President of the former Rotary Club of Canberra City.

He came to Canberra to a position as lecturer at the Royal Military College Duntroon, and later moved into the public service where he held various positions in the Department of Transport, Bureau of Transport Economics and Office of Defence Production, where he was at one time Director of Capital Investment. Privatisation of that organisation saw his position disappear and he took up a teaching position at the Canberra Institute of Technology. He retired from teaching at CIT in 1998. Since retirement he has pursued an interest in exploring Australia, using a



Land Rover Discovery and a camping trailer to traverse a lot of the 'wide brown land'. Arising from that interest he has also served on a National Parks and Wildlife Service Advisory Committee for a period of ten years. He has had a long time interest in aviation, originally undertaking pilot training in the Bristol University Air Squadron, which he represented in inter-squadron aerobatics competition. He held a private pilot's licence for 26 years during which time he enjoyed a number of recreational flights around Australia before giving it up due to cost and time constraints.

He has been married to Ann (also a member of this club) for 59 years, and they have two sons; one a bachelor living in Canberra and the other married with a young daughter living in the Sunshine Coast.


